ICT tools also support practical learning with online tests, access to digital libraries and e-journals, and the use of non-print materials for various disciplines. Seminars and workshops leverage LCD projectors and multimedia content to enhance comprehension. By adopting these ICT-enabled methods, SRND College ensures a more interactive, resource-rich, and effective teaching-learning process, preparing students for a technology-driven world.

SRND College has a well-defined and transparent mechanism for internal assessment, managed by a dedicated Examination Committee. This committee, in coordination with the IQAC, ensures the continuous and effective implementation of the internal evaluation process throughout the academic year.

Since the 2017-18 academic year, the university has adopted the CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) pattern for undergraduate courses, allocating 40% weightage to internal assessment. The college adheres to the norms established by the university for internal evaluation. To maintain transparency, answer sheets are shown to students after evaluation, allowing them to understand their performance. Teachers also discuss the evaluation with students, providing constructive feedback and addressing any concerns.

Reforms introduced by the Examination Committee include preserving and documenting answer sheets for future reference.

In cases where students miss scheduled internal tests due to unavoidable circumstances, the college provides additional opportunities to ensure fairness.

The internal evaluation process includes continuous assessments, regular internal tests, and practical examinations for applicable courses. These measures ensure that the mechanism remains robust, student-centered, and transparent, fostering accountability and encouraging students to strive for academic excellence. Through this mechanism, SRND College upholds high standards in its assessment practices.

SRND College has established a robust and transparent mechanism to address grievances related to internal examinations, ensuring efficiency and timeliness. The institution maintains a zero-tolerance policy toward any discrepancies or disputes in exam-related processes.

Internal tests are conducted by individual departments, and the marks obtained by students are promptly displayed on the notice board, ensuring transparency. To minimize errors, the Examination Department employs a "read-and-check" process to verify the accuracy of internal marks before submission. This meticulous approach significantly reduces the chances of grievances.

The college has introduced reforms to enhance the transparency of the internal examination process. These include the internal squad system, which oversees the smooth and fair conduct of examinations, and the use of MCQ patterns in certain subjects to complement or replace descriptive assessments. Students are also encouraged to present seminars using traditional methods, fostering participatory learning.

Since the 2017-18 academic year, the Arts and Commerce faculties have implemented a centralized seating arrangement, with examination blocks interchanged daily to ensure fairness and

prevent malpractices. The Examination Committee monitors the continuous evaluation process throughout the academic year, ensuring that grievances, if any, are addressed promptly and effectively. These measures uphold the integrity and fairness of the internal examination system.

The POs, PSOs, and COs are meticulously designed by the respective departments after rigorous consultations with faculty members and stakeholders. These outcomes are then discussed and approved by the Board of Studies (BOS) of the concerned subject at the university level, which includes subject experts and faculty from affiliated colleges. The final endorsement is granted by the university's Vice-Chancellor, ensuring that the outcomes align with institutional and academic goals.

Programme Outcomes (POs) are broad statements that outline the professional skills, interrelated knowledge, and personality traits students are expected to acquire by the end of the program. They reflect the holistic development the institution aims to achieve for its graduates. On the other hand, Course Outcomes (COs) are specific statements detailing the essential disciplinary knowledge, skills, and depth of learning that students should gain upon completing a particular course.

The Heads of Departments (HODs) play a vital role in creating awareness about POs, PSOs, and COs among students during orientations and regular interactions. These outcomes are clearly defined, communicated, and integrated into the learning

process to ensure transparency and focused academic development.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

At SRND College, the attainment of Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) is systematically evaluated to ensure that the learning objectives of the programs are met effectively. The institution uses a structured approach to measure the achievement of POs by mapping Course Outcomes (COs) to the POs. This mapping helps in quantitatively assessing how well the program outcomes are achieved through the courses offered.

Each course contributing to the POs is assessed using both direct and indirect evaluation methods. Direct assessments include internal examinations, semester-end exams, and quizzes, where each question is specifically linked to the corresponding COs. The attainment of a CO is determined by the average marks scored by students on these assessments, with a target set for final attainment. Additionally, the practical courses are evaluated to ensure they contribute to at least one or more defined program outcomes.

Indirect assessments are conducted through feedback surveys, student reflections, and other evaluative tools to gauge the learning experience and its alignment with the expected outcomes. The results from these evaluations are compared with the expected level of attainment to determine if the PO has been satisfied. A target percentage (e.g., 80% of students scoring above a certain threshold) is used as a benchmark for determining CO attainment.

This comprehensive evaluation process ensures that both the program and course outcomes are effectively achieved, guiding continuous improvements in the curriculum and teaching methods.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

The institution operates across two campuses owned by the Sanstha, spanning 4.5 acres, with the aim of providing quality education, personality development, and professional training. The college offers 14 spacious classrooms, including ICT-enabled ones, along with well-equipped computer and science laboratories. Additional infrastructure includes a full-fledged library, principal and vice-principal cabins, administrative offices, and a dedicated sports department.

The campus features a botanical garden, separate common rooms for girls, track-and-field sports facilities, and a recognized geography laboratory. The institution is committed to inclusivity, with provisions such as ramps, a divyang-friendly lavatory, and an RO system for safe drinking water.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

The institution offers comprehensive facilities for cultural activities, sports, games, and fitness, supporting students' physical and mental well-being. Indoor facilities include a multi-gym with advanced equipment such as a five-station gym, exercise bench, tummy twister, and weightlifting sets with platforms. These resources are regularly used by students for daily exercise, weightlifting, powerlifting, and physique-building practice. The gymnasium hall spans 40 sq. m.

Yoga sessions are conducted daily, promoting mental health, reducing stress, and building strength. The institution also addresses students' personal challenges to help them balance their focus between academics and sports.

The college provides excellent indoor and outdoor sports facilities managed by the Gymkhana Department. Indoor activities include yoga, weightlifting, powerlifting, bodybuilding, and wrestling. Outdoor facilities include a well-maintained playground and a 200-meter, 6-lane track for athletics. Dedicated spaces are available for various sports such as Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, volleyball, cricket, badminton, long jump, triple jump, high jump, and shot put.

Special care is taken to maintain the playground, particularly during the rainy season. The outdoor playground area spans 6831 sq. m., ensuring ample space for diverse sporting activities. These facilities encourage holistic development and active participation in physical and cultural activities.

The library offers a modern and conducive environment for study, equipped with advanced facilities to cater to students' academic needs. It houses a collection of 25,633 books and subscriptions to 16 journals and magazines. Additionally, the library provides photocopying services, e-library facilities, and access to both subscribed e-resources and open-access materials.

Solid Waste Management: Non-teaching staff maintain cleanliness in classrooms, buildings, and the campus, segregating waste into color-coded bins placed strategically. The NSS unit organizes weekly campus cleaning camps. Paper waste, including old newspapers, is sent for recycling, and used examination answer books are returned to the university for recycling. Organic waste, dried leaves, and other biodegradable materials are collected in pits to produce organic manure, which is used to nurture plants on campus.

Liquid Waste Management: Liquid waste from laboratories is managed using sedimentation and dewatering techniques to separate water from solid waste. A well-planned drainage system effectively handles effluent from toilets, washrooms, and laboratories, ensuring no water stagnation and maintaining hygiene standards.

E-Waste Management: Electronic waste, such as CDs, bulbs, and outdated electronic components, is collected from various departments and offices. These items are safely transported to authorized agencies for secure disposal to minimize environmental impact.

Recycling and Hazardous Waste: Recycling initiatives, including organic composting and paper reuse, promote sustainable practices. Though no biomedical or radioactive waste is generated, hazardous chemical waste from labs is disposed of according to standard safety protocols.
